## GOOD NEWS FROM three De Shae's (Story

eShae was working and living in Rutherford County With her five children. She was laid off from her job, and things went downhill quickly. DeShae says her mental health was suffering, and she wasn't getting treated. She ended up losing her license, which made it impossible to keep a job, and eventually led to loss of housing. DeShae had trouble keeping childcare because she had no address, and no childcare made it impossible to work. These factors piled on top of each other making DeShae's situation harder and harder to overcome.

Thankfully, DeShae contacted Thrive and was accepted into the Housing Case Management Program. Even with the help of her Case Manager at Thrive, DeShae still couldn't find adequate housing in Rutherford County; she and her Case Manager searched for months without success. Many don't realize that Thrive receives federal housing funds which restrict the rent amount Thrive can pay. The Fair Market Rate (FMR) is the maximum amount Thrive can pay and it varies by county. The FMR was approximately \$800 a month in Rutherford County for rent

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and utilities for the size of home DeShae and her children needed. At that time, units were renting in Rutherford for \$1,800-\$2,900 a month! After nearly six months of DeShae living in her car and finding nothing, her Case Manager convinced her to move to Henderson County. While housing is not more affordable there, the FMR is higher in Henderson.

Shae and her Case Manager found a place in Henderson County, but the move was not simple. DeShae's entire support system is in Rutherford County, so her Case Manager has had to serve as her new support system. For example, since DeShae has a mental illness, she works with the ACT Team in Rutherford County - this is a group of agency providers who work together to make sure that DeShae is getting the healthcare she needs to stay healthy. The ACT Team in Henderson County has a waitlist, so DeShae will have to wait a few months before she can receive this service.

eShae's Case Manager works hard to support her; she helped her move into housing and Thrive provided furniture and housing supplies. Thrive helped DeShae connect to supports and resources in Henderson County, helped her enroll her children in school, and get set up with the Salvation Army Kicks for Kids program so they could get new shoes and school supplies.

• Shae says she doesn't know what she would do without Thrive. She says her Case Manager has helped her in a million ways to get everything she needs to be successful. If there is something she needs that her Case Manager doesn't know about, she will find the answer. DeShae couldn't afford a phone or Internet, so she relied on her Case Manager to get everything she needed, and she says she always came through. DeShae says about her Case Manager, "She is like an angel for us. She truly makes me believe that God exists."

In December, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) released its data collected for the 2023 Point in Time (PIT) count. The PIT count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered individuals experiencing homelessness on



a single night in January. According to the data, homelessness in the regions we serve has increased by about 40%. If you're interested in learning more about HUD or the PIT count, visit www.ncceh.org/datacenter/pitdata
